

Class Project Week Six

This week for your class project, you will create an abstract, or problem statement, for your poster. The problem statement should be clear and brief (three to six sentences) with an appropriate scope.

Since your poster will be judged, in large part, by how appropriate a solution the remainder of your poster presents, your problem statement is especially important. The measure of appropriate scope is one that can have a solution presented by your poster.

Journal Assignment Six

For this week's journal (blog) article, you will need to locate a current online news article that relates to your chosen poster topic. Ideally, this would be an article that demonstrates the importance and relevance of your chosen topic.

Post online a brief (one to three paragraphs) essay that explains why you selected that article and why the article is important. Better blogs will include references to related articles and publications.

Your essay should link to the selected article. Come to class next week prepared to discuss your article.

Outside Reading Assignment Six

This week you will locate and select a scholarly journal article that relates to your chosen poster problem. While you may choose any source, it is expected that the source for your article will be similar to those that we have utilized in previous outside readings.
